ST PATRICK'S COLLEGE SENIOR BALL



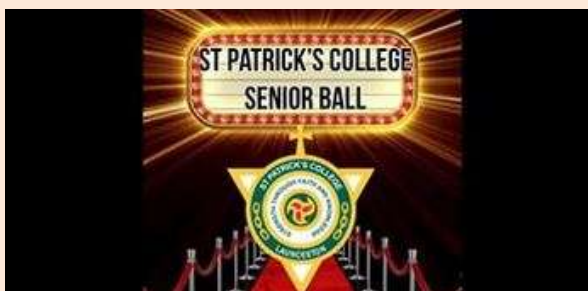
Our beautiful Bjork Hansen on her way to St Patricks College Ball with a photograph taken at the Penny Royal Launceston.
