We are battling along with Jacindas illness without any improvement in her condition but at least it is stable. She now has a port above her heart for intravenous feeding as well as a line stitched into her bowel for supplementary feeding also a venting tube coming out of her stomach. It is not much of a life when you are hooked up to these lines for your nourishment. Unfortunately she is unable to work due to the constant pain and nausea and lack of energy. In saying all of that she is not the only one in Launceston suffering this condition and we are fighting very hard to raise funds to help the people suffering this illness. We had a golf day where we raised \$7,500.00 .The state Govt. thru Peter Gutwein donated \$10,000.00 with another \$20,000.00 shortly. We also raised another \$2,000.00 for Devonport Rotary for the Teddy bear drop and are now working on the Soggy bottom boat festival with Youngtown Rotary. Later in the year Evandale football Club are going to support us with another fundraiser as well.

Please pass my thanks onto your members and if they would like an update presented to them I am happy to speak at anytime.
