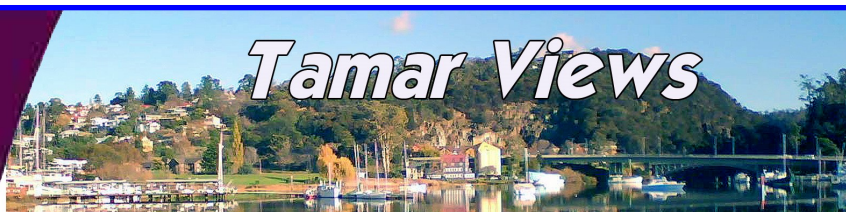

## NOTES FROM LAST WEEK'S MEETING

### **Dennis Tulk:**

Spoke about website – bulletins now in main body of site. Noted that we can change our own passwords, and no dates of birth are shown in website. Dennis also answered sundry queries from members.

### **President Krista:**

Announced that Harry Galea will take on the job of President for 2019-20 (due to Lara's workload).

Commented on our ongoing involvement in the local Migrant Resource Centre.

Asked for input from members on future ways the club can provide financial support to various people and/or organisations.

Noted that an extra one-off grant to Catholic Care for homeless people ID's was agreed to by the board at its March meeting.

Our support for 'Care for Africa' this year is part of a 2 year support programme.

### **Josh De Groot:**

Outlined the proposed application of the club to the Tasmanian Community Fund for a grant for a community garden at potential sites. Those who have expressed interest in this proposal are the Lilydale School and the Northern Support Centre. The application will be put in within the next two or three weeks.

### **Members Queries:**

**PP Glenda Iles**– asked for members to give thought to ways in which prospective members can be introduced to the club.

**Les Grant** queried the expenditure on Homeless ID's. It was explained that this was a one-off extension to the previously established and approved policy of the club to redirect some of the money for street swags for this purpose due to the temporary lack of demand for the swags in past years.

**Kevin Preece** expressed the view that there is currently a gap between the board and the club, and that board decisions should be communicated to the members in much more detail, and cited the two matters raised above as examples.

## NOTES FROM BOARD MEETING 14TH MARCH

**Update** on application for \$70,000 to Tasmanian Community Fund for community garden as presented to last board meeting.

**President 2019-20** – Harry Galea to take on president's role, Lara to be President-Elect.

**Treasurer's Report** tabled. Club is in a sound financial position.

**Migrant Resource Centre** – all work completed and money spent.

**Longford Blooms** – Graeme Le Fevre met with committee re taking a proposal to the Northern Midlands Council for future events.

**Launceston Urban Fringe Trail** – a proposal has been received from Assistant Governor Brett Williams for Rotary involvement – our contribution would be \$200 and would be for signage etc. More info to come.

**Potential BBQ event for Pirtek** on 4<sup>th</sup> April – Graeme Le Fevre to follow up.

**Agfest** – Board has committed as per last board meeting – as long as we can fill the roster. Work to be done on van to council requirements.

**Approved \$410 for Ayumi** to do a specialist course in English if she has time. Lance to report back.

**Queechey High School** have asked for assistance with their Formula 1 in Schools competition. Will be asked to make a presentation to the club.

**National Youth Science Forum.** There is a potential applicant from Tamar Sunrise. Wayne Higgs to follow up. Has organised Jenny Sims to speak to the Club. Board approved \$1000 to RYLA if a suitable candidate is found.

**Rotary Foundation** Giving from the club has been normally \$1000 per year. Josh is to look at a proposal to hold events to raise money for this specific purpose. Resolved that we continue the \$1000 commitment for this year.

**Club Meeting Duties.** Terry has prepared draft detailed duty sheets for all meeting roles. To be brought to next board meeting

**Catholic Care.** Approved a further one off contribution of \$2000 for homeless persons ID. This follows previous expenditure from the street swags funds, as previously approved.
