## ROTARY INTERNATIONAL WASH PROJECTS.



Through water, sanitation, and hygiene (WASH) programs, Rotary's people of action mobilize resources, form partnerships, and invest in infrastructure and training that yield long-term change.

Rotary International has partnered with the United States Agency for International Development (USAID) to support lasting, positive change in water, sanitation, and hygiene (WASH).

This unique public-private partnership leverages the business skills and community leadership of our volunteers with USAID's technical expertise and government relationships.

Some projects are:

### **The Philippines.**

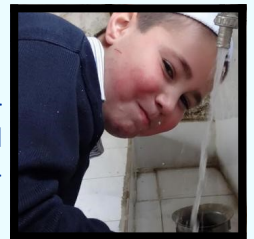
Rotary clubs and partners built 222 toilets, six rainwater collectors, seven communal handwashing stations, and 20 biosand filters. The project provided more than 1,000 people with access to proper toilet facilities and almost 600 people with a regular supply of clean water.

### **Lebanon.**

All 24 of Lebanon's Rotary clubs came together — overcoming religious, cultural, and political divisions — to form partnerships with the government, World Vision, UNICEF, and the Red Cross. Together the groups developed a program that delivers clean water to every public school in the country.

### **Tanzania.**

A dozen Rotary clubs collaborated with local partners to establish a water supply and delivery system for 1,500 people in the village of Kigogo, Tanzania. They also taught the community how to maintain the systems and provided hygiene education. The infrastructure has been installed and water is flowing to collection points within the village. A celebration was held to mark the transfer of ownership of the water system to the village. And what a celebration it was!
