#### LAST WEEK'S GUEST SPEAKERS



Last week's guest speaker was Kevin Preen, CEO of CatholicCare. Kevin said that CatholicCare operates in three regions in Tasmania. It has one centre in the North, one in the South and two in the North-West. It provides housing for victims of family violence and also helps multicultural aged persons. CathoicCare provides 70% of housing support services in Northern Tasmania. The organisation deals with 70-100 referrals each month. Its referrals are in the area of family violence and family support for clients not involved in the criminal justice system.

It also helps aged people in need of help—for example a person who has lost their partner and still has a mortgage on their house. They need assistance with refinancing or finding alternative accommodation.

CatholicCare also helps young people who have left home, often because of family disputes.

One of the issues that CatholicCare helps clients with, and one which has been supported financially by our club for the past four years, is that of establishing identity documentation. If people, particularly women, flee a domestic violence situation, they are not able to gather together their personal identity papers, such as birth certificates and driver's licences. CatholicCare also helps people with police and credit checks, which are required by people seeking rental accommodation.

Clients are not in a position to afford the fees associated with obtaining these items and this is where our club's assistance has been invaluable. Kevin said that state or federal government funding they receive to assist clients is subject to strict criteria, which doesn't include the cost of replacing identity documents and obtaining credit checks. So far this year CatholicCare has helped 400 people with identity documents and 100 with credit checks. It also receives about 30 family violence referrals per month and has three teams specifically helping disabled people who experience family violence.

CatholicCare also employs counsellors in most Catholic schools, where family violence is the main issue they encounter. It is also the main issue that presents for homeless and aged care clients. Clients often bring multiple issues with them—mental health, drug and alcohol problems and housing issues. Kevin said that a major problem is that there is simply not enough public housing and support services available. These matters just add to client trauma.



Assistant Governor Brett Williams was also present at last week's club meeting and he spoke briefly about a major project that the District is promoting this year. It is aiming to support Purple House, an indigenous owned and run health service based in Alice Springs. Its CEO is Sarah Brown. It helps indigenous people who need kidney dialysis, by operating 16 clinics and a mobile unit called 'The Purple Truck.' The aim of their services

is to help people who need dialysis to stay close to their families.

The organisation also provides practical help to remote aboriginal communities using volunteers with car-

pentry and building skills. District Governor Michael Cooke's wife, Corinna, is also promoting a project to provide hygiene items for aboriginal women.
