Club subscriptions now due - please feel free to pay asap if you haven't already done so.

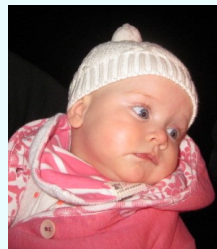
