# LAST WEEK'S GUEST SPEAKER

Last week's guest speaker was Brian Carlton.

Brian is well known as the talkback host on current affairs at LAFM.

He gave a very interesting summary of his pathway to talkback radio, and his views on various issues. He has had 35 years in the business, starting at 2UE and other radio stations, researching for talk shows, documentaries, and organising outside broadcasts. He has worked with Alan Jones, Phillip Adams, and many of the current affairs icons of Australia.

He enjoys the reality of spontaneous radio talkback, and interaction with real people.

He grew up in a working family but in a somewhat isolated location, and developed an interest in social issues, the community and international matters very early on in his life. He has a concern for community amenity, and sees some disintegration in this area at the moment.

Brian has been in Tasmania for four years and is very happy to call Launceston home.

Some of the events he noted leading into his career were the shootings of Israeli athletes in the 1972 Olympics, seeing documentaries on World War 2, especially in relation to genocide, and events in the Middle East.

He gave an extensive summary of his experiences and views of what is happening in the Middle East, especially the conflicts between the Arab states and Israel. His radio program will often give a slightly different view from what has become the accepted national media approach to the situation. In these endeavours he can often go into what have become 'taboo' areas and opinions. He gave a detailed description of the national policy of the Jewish State, and how that affects the situation in the region.

# **TEACHING TEACHERS**



Realizing that getting children into schools isn't enough to solve illiteracy, Rotary shifts to mentoring and coaching teachers

More than a hundred teachers in Guatemala each received several in-classroom coaching sessions over eight months. They learned how to replace rote memorization drills and repetition of words on a blackboard with exercises that engage their students in critical thinking.

After decades of investing in literacy projects, experts have realized that simply getting children into the classroom — either by removing attendance barriers or providing supplies — is not

enough. Before students can succeed, the quality of the teaching in that classroom needs to improve.
