Nigerian physician Dr. Tunji Funsho has been named one of TIME Magazine's 100 Most Influential People in the World. He was honoured for this work with Rotary International to eradicate wild polio in Africa. On 25th August, Africa was declared wild polio free.

AND FINALLY.....

On ABC Classic radio this last week there was discussion about conductor Sir Thomas Beecham and some of his memorable quotes. Here are some of them:

Sir Thomas, who it was said, had something of an eye for the ladies, was asked why female opera singers tend to be of the buxom variety. He said,

"Unfortunately those who sing like birds eat like horses and vice-versa."

"Don't look at the trombones, it only encourages them."

"Have you heard any Stockhausen?" Beecham was asked. "No, but I believe I have stepped in some."

"It is quite untrue that British people don't appreciate music. They may not understand it, but they absolutely love the noise it makes."
