LAST WEEK'S GUEST SPEAKER.

Last week's guest speaker was Barbara Walters from Rural Alive and Well. (RAW). Barbara said she has had a previous association with Rotary when she went to New Zealand as a Rotary Youth Exchange Student some years ago.

RAW is a Tasmanian organisation which started about ten years ago after a northern midlands farmer was concerned about his colleagues after some had committed suicide. The organisation's main philosophy is 'talk to a mate', in other words it wants to help people to help each other—to meet them where they are.

Barbara has been with RAW for about seven months. She came from a background of working with disadvantaged youth and this caused her to look at the needs of rural young people, not just farmers and their partners. RAW has now set in place a program focusing on youth needs called 'The Next Generation Program'.



RAW is partnering with Rotary Community Care running programs focusing on rural mental heath issues. Barbara said it is putting boots on the ground as a grass-roots service to rural communities. Its slogan is 'Are You Bogged Mate'? (See poster on previous page.) It its providing a 24/7 chat line on a 1300 number.

RAW has established a training arm to provide resources for staff in mental health first aid. Self-harm is one issue on which they wish to focus. They are establishing a data base covering clients needs and giving RAW the means to track progress. They are classifying client needs into three zones—red, orange and green. They aim to move clients from red and orange zones into green using a non-clinical approach. RAW does have staff members who are psychologists or have accredited mental health training. RAW's staff will refer clients on to specialist services such as Alcohol and Drugs, Family Violence and Financial services when this is deemed appropriate.

RAW is endeavoring to be pre-emptive in preparing for natural disasters. It has increased staff to cope with the demands arising from drought and the Covid 19 pandemic.

Barbara said that RAW has recently engaged staff with experience in working in the seafood industry. She expressed gratitude for support from Rotary around the state for RAW's programs.
