LAST WEEK'S GUEST SPEAKER.

Last week's guest speaker was Sarah Wright, a year 12 student at Launceston Church Grammar School. Sarah was sponsored by our club to attend the 2021 National Youth Science Forum.

Sarah said that previously she was unsure about what her future career path would be. She is interested in arts and music and thought she might be following further study in that area. However a teacher at Grammar suggested she apply to attend the National Youth Science Forum. She did so and was accepted into the program. She was disappointed to learn that she would not be able to travel to Canberra for the forum this year. It would be held on-line due to Covid 19 restrictions.



However, it did have benefits. The on-line process put her in touch with over 400 other participants and also with eminent scientists such as Dr Kart Kruszelnicki.

Sarah said that the students were divided into focus groups which concentrated on particular areas of study. This gave opportunity for socialising, compensating for the lack of face-to-face contact. Sarah said her groups focused on Antarctic studies and also the Large Hadron Collider.

Sarah is interested in science-related research and participated in a project which compared the DNA of Koalas and Quokkas.

Tasmanian students were given the opportunity to travel to Hobart for some face-to-face activities, which included a visit to a TasNetworks facility. Sarah was particularly interested in the subject of various venoms and their use in medicine and surgery—particularly in relation to heart transplants.

Sarah pointed out that STEM subjects and careers are becoming of increasing interest to girls. Girls were in the majority at this year's NYSF and Sarah said they are also in the majority in STEM courses at her school. As a result of her involvement with NYSF this year, Sarah has firmed up her career choice. Next year she intends to enroll in a biomedical science degree course at the University of Adelaide.

Sarah said she is now in regular contact with other NYSF participants and can thoroughly recommend the experience, in spite of this year's limitations, to other young people interested in science and engineering. Sarah expressed her thanks to our club for sponsoring her to the NYSF, which for her was a life-changing experience.
