LAST WEEK'S GUEST SPEAKER

Last week's guest speaker was Will Smith from JCP Empowering Youth. Will has previously spoken to our club about his organisation's work, but this time he came to thank the club for the money JCP received from the recent Friendship Ball organised by our club and to give an indication of how the money is being used.

When Will last came to speak at our club, he had just resigned from the Tasmanian Police Force. He previously volunteered his time to the organisation on a part-time basis. He now is engaged full-time in JCP leadership programs focused on making a change in the lives of at-risk youth.

Will said none of the money given to JCP for its work is spent on administration costs. JCP runs fee-for-service leadership courses, the income from which covers administration costs. Will stressed that all of the money JCP received from the Friendship Ball – over \$9,000.00, is being spent on helping disadvantaged youth in Launceston.



Will said that they classify youth that come to them for help in three levels according to the urgency of need or the level of disadvantage. Youth classified as level one have dropped out of school or are at risk of doing so. Level one programs aid at getting such youth back into regular school attendance. Will pointed out that 70% of young people referred to JCP are classified as level one.

Level two youth are those at risk of going to jail. They generally live at home, often in poor circumstances and are demonstrating poor behaviour choices. The aim is to provide support and engage such young people in leadership programs that will hopefully steer them away from committing crimes and set them upon a better path in life.

Young people classified as level three have often already fallen foul of the justice system, may having been in jail or youth detention. The main aim of level three programs run by JCP is to keep such young people alive, as the risks they are under or involve themselves in are at a quite serious level.

Will narrated the circumstances of two young people currently being part of JCP's programs. Their circumstances were quite harrowing and Will said that it was the money JCP received from the Friendship Ball that enabled the organisation to come to the aid of these young people and provide them with a range of supports they desperately needed. JCP is currently having to provide accommodation for some young people because accommodation for at-risk youth in northern Tasmania is non-existent at present. Providing accommodation is not part of JCP's core programming, but is having to be provided out of sheer necessity. JCP's main focus is to provide camps and other leadership focused activities to release potential in young people, which is often stymied by their home, family and other circumstances.

Will concluded by thanking the club for its interest in and support of his organisation. His presentation left club members in no doubt that the money he had received from Rotary was making a vital difference to the lives of worthy young people in Launceston.
