

LAST WEEK'S GUEST SPEAKER

Last week's guest speaker was Erin Roles, Youth Director of the St Vincent de Paul Society.

Erin brought with her a large Monopoly type chart, which she spread out on the floor. She divided Rotarians into four teams and team members advanced around the board, standing on squares in response to numbers shown by the throwing of a die.



Landing on a particular square exposed the participant to a dilemma faced by a homeless or disadvantaged person. Such dilemmas were rationing money, causing choices to be made on competing demands of expenditure. For example, a new baby may mean that existing accommodation is no longer adequate, but upgrading will cause rent to be no longer affordable. A choice may have to be made whether to take a sick child to a doctor or the hospital emergency department. Does a job-seeker spend scarce money on presentable clothes for a job interview, or register for unemployment benefits with Centrelink? Disadvantaged people have little experience in accessing government or other agencies and this can be challenging, particularly if they have limited language skills. Applicants often don't know what options and helps are available to them to assist with their particular need.

In the process of the game, Erin spoke about other problems faced by homeless and disadvantaged people, such as the difficulty of accessing government services when you have no fixed address. Life can be a day-by-day challenge of survival.

Erin said that people, usually women, fleeing domestic violence, face particular challenges, as they are usually in a very fragile emotional state. Fortunately, Erin said, much more help is available to needy people currently than in the past through government and charitable agencies such as the St Vincent de Paul Society.
