NOTES FROM LAST WEEK'S MEETING

Andrea wanted Harry to remind members that DG Mike is attending our meeting in 2 weeks (17th August), and she would like as many members as possible to attend that meeting.

As guest speaker organiser, Harry noted that Phil Niejalke is in the bulletin as presenting his talk next week, but that will now be later on. In the meantime, Harry has arranged for Dr Frank Madill to talk on 'Medical Mysteries'. Dr Frank always provides an excellent talk on whatever subject it is.

Harry advised that there is a container at Jenny Watkin's place which has been there for a long time, and contains a lot of old Rotary material. It needs cleaning out so it can be disposed of. LAST WEEK'S GUEST SPEAKER

At last week's club meeting the guest speaker was the club's resident adventurer and raconteur PP Dale Luck.

Dale brought us up to speed on his latest adventure – a kayaking trip around Hinchinbrook Island in Queensland. Dale was invited to join the rip by his friend and former club member Anna McGrane. The trip was a birthday resent for Anna from her children who joined her on the trip together with . The members of the trip were the seven family members and Dale, travelling in four two-person kayaks. They had guides in front and in the rear of them as they travelled. The family members were



experienced kayakers, but it was a new experience for Dale. He had done some training in Kingston before undertaking the trip. One instruction was – don't bring beer! Wine and spirits were O.K. though.

The journey began at Lucinda, Queensland, south of Hinchinbrook Island, travelling around the eastern side of the island to Mission Beach in the north. Travel in the channel between the island and the mainland was not possible as that area is crocodile infested. Dale said the weather and the water were warm. The surrounding land featured many sugar-cane farms. Dale pointed out that taking many photos was not really possible from the kayak, as the main preoccupation was trying to stay upright. However, Dale was able to take some photos, using a small waterproof camera he took with him. The kayaks were six metres in length into which was packed gear, tents, water and food. Loading and launching the kayaks each day was a major undertaking. Threats from wildlife was not a problem, but sandflies were.

The jetty at Lucinda is almost six kilometres long and is the longest in Australia. At that length, it is affected by the curvature of the earth. The kayak journey covered 94 km and took five days. The group camped on beaches in tents. Dale said they found it both windy and noisy. In the kayaks they mainly enjoyed tailwinds. On one day they travelled 17 km in open ocean. Dale said that travelling in a one to two metre swell does not sound to be much of a problem, but the perspective from sitting in a kayak can be quite intimidating. The key is to keep the kayak facing into the swell, which Dale said he and Anna managed to do with one exception. They were hit with a two and a half metre side-on wave crest, which caused their kayak to capsize. Finding yourself upside down under a kayak is not a pleasant experience, according to Dale. He managed to keep calm and remember his training for such situations. Releasing himself from the kayak didn't quite go to plan, but he did eventually surface and was relieved to see Anna also above the water. The guides managed to right the kayak, but getting the water out of it and getting back into it from the water is quite a challenge. Dale said kayaking meant that you were constantly wet and more so if it was raining.

Dale paid tribute to the support guides – they served up delicious and varied meals each evening. Dale finished by pointing out that 10 people are killed in the world each year by sharks, but 150 are killed by falling coconuts!
