LAST WEEK'S GUEST SPEAKER

Last week's guest speaker was our District Governor, Mike Patten. DG Mike is visiting the 44 clubs throughout Tasmania. He is looking forward to meeting as many Rotarians as he can and hearing lots about the great things happening around the district.

Ten years have passed since the new rotary brand was launched and Mike was very pleased to see that we tick all the boxes displaying the current logo and brand. The Rotary brand and the Rotary wheel are well recognised in society. We need to make sure your branding is up to date and consistent.

Membership is an ongoing matter. Rotary has been loosing on average 30 members a year from our district. Last year 23. So we do have to do something about our membership if we want to continue the work we are doing. Also the problem that the district is supposed to have 1200 members. We have 1045 at present. His challenge to every club in the state is to increase their membership by two members in July next. 88 additional members in our district and if you did that for a few years we would be back to 1200 where we are supposed to be.

A big part of how we get new people to join is the way we present ourselves as clubs when they come through our door. We need to think about what a 30 year old is going to think when they come through our door, a 50 year old, a 75 year old. We need to have a look at current meetings and procedures. Do we need the formality? Because young people are not keen on formality. Prayers and anthems are not appropriate today and we have to look at our clubs to see if there is something we can do make us more attractive to all these different groups – the men, women, migrants that we would like to join us. We also need to thank our members as often as we possibly can. We can't overdo that. There are a few awards that we can give people within Rotary. Avenues of Service Awards (in house) and DG signs off on it.

Cost of Rotary is also an issue. Paying to be a volunteer is always a question for young people in Particular and we need to appeal to the next generation. Young families and retirees find this an issue. We need to try to make attendance at Rotary as accessible as possible.

This year the District Family Weekend will be held in the Huon Valley from 13th to 15th October. Please note the change of date from November. The Huon Valley is go go and we had to find a weekend when accommodation was available. There will be a BBQ on the Friday night, a tour of the Wooden Boat School, a river cruise and a dinner at the Kermandie Hotel on the Saturday and the District AGM on Sunday. Excellent food and beverage options are available all weekend.

There are plans underway for Peace Poles appear all over the state. Great work Rotary Club of Devonport North in particular. The goal of 100 Peace Poles for our Centenary year is looking doable.

The DLT has confirmed the districts support for the elimination of single use plastic in Rotary projects. Many Councils are also working to this gaol so please keep this in mind when organising events.

World Polio Day is 24th October. End Polio Now is Rotary Internationals most significant and best-known project. World President Gordon McInally is very keen for Rotary Clubs to commit the funds needed to finally eliminate Polio from the world. Keep an eye out for events on that day.
