LAST WEEK'S GUEST SPEAKER



Last week's guest speaker was Stephanie Trethewey from Motherland.

Stephanie lives on a farm in Central North Tasmania with her husband Sam and her son Elliot, and little girl Evie.

Becoming a mum was a baptism of fire for Steph, and she wasn't at all prepared for the unique challenges that come with raising kids on the land. With no family, friends or mother's groups nearby to support her, it soon became very clear that too many rural mums are raising their children without a village, and they desperately need one.

So she created Motherland to celebrate and connect rural mums around the country by providing a platform and online community dedicated to supporting rural mothers and reducing the isolation many of us feel.

Rural mums are some of the most under-valued, under-supported, and under-celebrated women in the country. And while they are all so different, there is much that ties them together.

It's Stephanie's mission to put rural motherhood on the map, and enable the incredible mothers who are the backbone of our rural communities, to form meaningful connections with each other. Through her podcast she shares the raw reality of rural motherhood, and through their online program Motherland Village, they are connecting country mums around Australia and enabling them to form meaningful connections that last.

No matter where you live or what you do, we're in this together mama, and you're not alone.

Motherland's mission is to eliminate the crippling isolation many rural mums face by creating an online village and support that every rural mum can access, regardless of her location.

We are very proud of Senri. He is engaging with many local Rotary clubs and is no longer the shy young man who arrived from the Solomons but has become an interesting and informative speaker at the many club meetings he is attending.
