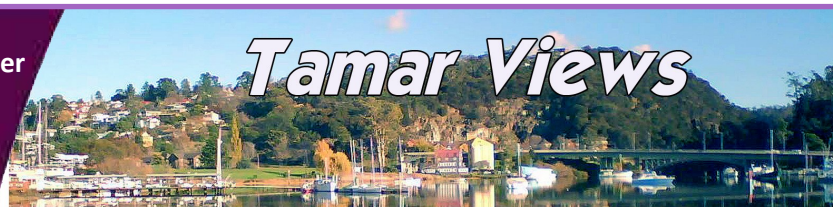

Notes of Meeting 19th October 2023

President Andrea

Noted that this is Rotarian Wayne's last official meeting as a member of this club. He and Rue are relocating to Victoria. We wish them all the best for the future, and will miss their most valuable contributions to many Club projects.

Thanked Dale L for his work on organising the Show Gate - a successful outcome.

Community Service – Harry G

Dale L advised on behalf of Harry G as follows –

Tanzania Water Bores

As of October, the total income is \$154,147. The expenditure is \$141,586 resulting in 5 bores fully completed and 2 others bores in progress.

Food Propagation Project

Timber had been received and cut and drilled to size - currently being stored at Student Works. The first set of beds will be installed at Student Works in 2-4 weeks closely followed by security and animal proof fencing. The second set will be at Northern Suburbs Community Centre - the centre has cleared the site ready for construction. The third set will be at a site managed by the Migrant Resource Centre. The project will require minimum volunteer resources - that said 2-3 will be handy to rake soil in the beds working alongside a small front end loader. This work will be weekday. It is expected the project will be substantially complete by Christmas.

Vinnies on Boland Christmas Market - 25th Nov 2023

The St Vinnies store in Boland Street will hold their annual Christmas market. SLRC will be the sole organisation operating a food stall - profits will be retained by the Club. The BBQ/drinks stall will operate between 9am and 3pm hence 2 shifts will be required. Numbers will be taken next week but we will likely need 6-7 each shift plus 4 pre-event organising food, setup BBQ and drink.

Dale L also thanked members who contributed to the Show Gate – it was a big project and needed the help of Kings Meadows, Youngtown and Tamar Sunrise clubs. It was a very successful outcome.
